WHEREAS, according to the American Cancer Society, lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer deaths in both men and women in the United States making up almost 25% of all cancer deaths, with approximately 130,180 deaths and 236,740 new cases in 2022; and

WHEREAS, lung cancer accounts for more deaths each year than the next three most common cancers combined (colon, breast, and prostate) and more than half of people with lung cancer die within one year of being diagnosed; and

WHEREAS, cigarette smoking is by far the most important risk factor for lung cancer and is responsible for close to 90 percent of deaths, with exposure to radon gas as the second leading cause of lung cancer in the United States; and

WHEREAS, smoking cigarettes is expected to cause about 8 out of 10 deaths from lung cancer in 2022; and

WHEREAS, an estimated 3,000 deaths will occur from lung cancer in New Jersey in 2022; and

WHEREAS, shared decision making between clinicians and current and former smokers on the benefits, uncertainties and harms associated with lung cancer screening process should be a part of the process; and

WHEREAS, advocacy and increased public awareness about the disease will result in innovations in lung cancer research, improved early detection methods and better medical treatment for lung cancer and other lung diseases;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Philip D. Murphy, Governor of the State of New Jersey, do hereby proclaim:

NOVEMBER 2022 AS LUNG CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

in New Jersey and urge all citizens to help increase awareness of lung cancer issues and facilitate early screening for this disease.
